**About the Music:** Jane Marshall (b. 1924), composer of the anthem "The Prayers I Make" is a strong advocate of congregational song and has written a number of hymn tunes, as well as serving on the editorial committees of several hymnbooks. A prolific choral composer, many of her compositions for choir are in publication and are frequently performed. The anthem is a setting of a text by Michelangelo Buonarroti (1475-1564), who personified the term "Renaissance Man." He was an Italian sculptor, painter, architect, poet, and engineer of the High Renaissance who is regarded as one of the greatest artists of all time.
