# About Today's Service

About the Music: Today's music comes from one of the great voices in western music. Felix Mendelssohn was a pianist, organist, composer and conductor of the early Romantic Period. A grandson of the philosopher Moses Mendelssohn, he was born into a prominent German Jewish banking family. Initially raised without religion, he was later baptized as a Reformed Christian. Recognized early as a prodigy, he parents did not seek to capitalize on his talent. He performed throughout Europe and was especially well-received in Britain where he was a great favorite of Queen Victoria, whose daughter used the "Wedding March" from Mendelssohn's music for "Midsummer's Night Dream" as her wedding march, making that piece the standard for wedding processionals for more than 100 years.
