About the Music: The choral anthem this morning was originally a motet (set to a different text) by Giovanni Pierluigi da Palestrina, an Italian composer of the late Renaissance period. He came of age in 16th century Europe when "polyphony" was a dominant style of composition. Polyphony is characterized by a musical texture of simultaneous lines of melody that interact with each other with a skillful blend of independence and harmony. No one musical line is more important than another.
