About Today's Music: The vocal soloist this morning is Emily Shallbetter, one of the section leaders in the GPC choir. She sings The tune commonly associated with "Alleluia, Sing to Jesus" is titled "Hyfrydol", which was composed by the Welsh musician Rowland Hugh Prichard (1811–1887). He wrote "Hyfrydol" when he was only 20 years old. The word "Hyfrydol" can be translated to "tuneful" or "pleasant" in Welsh, and indeed, the melody is characterized by its pleasing and memorable contours, allowing for both exuberant and reflective interpretations.
