INTRODUCTION

DENIAL

Denial serves as an initial coping mechanism to navigate the pain of loss. During this stage, you may feel that life has become senseless, devoid of meaning, and overwhelmingly daunting. You initially resist accepting the reality of the news, leading to a sense of emotional numbness.

ANGER

Anger often emerges as you gradually re-engage with the harsh reality of your situation. During this stage, it is common to wrestle with feelings of "Why me?" and "Life isn't fair!" You may find yourself seeking to assign blame, possibly targeting others as the source of your grief. Sometimes, this anger might even be redirected towards close friends and family. For those with strong faith, this period may include questioning their belief in God, pondering the whereabouts of the Divine and why protection wasn't granted.

BARGAINING

Bargaining involves making pleas or promises in the face of adversity. It is when you might find yourself striking a deal with a higher power, saying something like, "Dear God, if you grant my husband healing, I promise to be a better wife." In a sense, this stage embodies a form of wishful thinking, where you attempt to convince yourself that you can circumvent grief through negotiation.

DEPRESSION

Depression often emerges as a response to the profound emptiness felt when we confront the reality of loss or the conclusion of a significant chapter in our lives. During this stage, you may find yourself retreating from daily life, enveloped in a pervasive numbness or a persistent mental haze, making it difficult to muster the energy to rise from bed. The world may appear exceedingly daunting, and facing it may seem an insurmountable task. The desire to isolate from others, coupled with a sense of speechlessness, can be overwhelming, and feelings of hopelessness may pervade your thoughts. In some cases, you might even grapple with thoughts of despair, questioning the purpose of carrying on.
