About Today's Service

About Today's Music: The anthem is by John Stainer (1840-1901). Knighted in 1888 by Queen Victoria for his services to church music, Stainer had a storied career as an organist, choral director and professor of music. "How Beautiful Upon the Mountains" is based on a text from Isaiah 52:7, and was first published in 1880. The Advent text reads: "How beautiful upon the mountains are the feet of him that bringeth good tidings, that publisheth peace; that publisheth salvation; that saith unto Zion, Thy God reigneth!"
